The European School of Radiology (ESOR) is celebrating the completion of ten years in action. Ten challenging and rewarding years of unfailing commitment and continuous investment in radiological education in Europe and worldwide. Ten years of envisioning, stimulating, engaging, delivering, teaching, tutoring, nurturing, and adding value to radiology.

It is the fulfilment of our common dream. ESOR has proven to be a dedicated multiplier in achieving the goals set in 2005 with the birth of the European Society of Radiology (ESR). ESOR continues today to assist generously in harmonising radiological education throughout Europe, by supporting the implementation of the European Training Curricula, to build a genuine and firm interest in subspecialisation in radiology and to raise the scientific profile in radiological education in Europe and the world.

With its expanded outreach programmes, the ASKLEPIOS Courses, the AIMS Schools and Seminars and the intercontinental Scholarships and Exchange Programmes for Fellowships, we are able to respond adequately to the actual needs of radiologists in the ‘developing’ world, following agreements between the ESR and corresponding member societies.

Beyond impressive numbers, ESOR is proud of its intangible assets, of being instrumental in mobilising the resources available for radiological education, and in creating a long-term educational commitment and structured network – the ESOR community – through partnership. All of this hugely appreciated use of teaching resources has been implemented with the unlimited support of highly esteemed and renowned lecturers, tutors, mentors, volunteer reference training centres, local organisers, subspecialty and national societies, academic and research institutions, and valued industrial partners. ESOR is and will remain greatly indebted to them all.

As we enter our next decade, I am confident that ESOR will maintain and elaborate further its leading role, as one of the major providers of complementary radiological education in Europe and worldwide. Anchoring within our society, it has the strategy, the organisation, the synergies and the dedication to embrace new challenges and build resilience in coping with the constant changes in our domain of science.

The ESOR: celebrating 10 years of unparalleled excellence in radiology education

“Life is a journey, not a destination”. This famous quote by Ralph Waldo Emerson is as true today as when he wrote it, almost two centuries ago. To travel successfully on the journey of Life, what is needed is an ambitious plan, a decent road map, a visionary guide, and the courage to press on, even when the going gets rough. This metaphor applies to how the European School of Radiology (ESOR) was created and how it is growing and blossoming. The *plan* was to deliver excellence in education to the radiological community, and especially to enhance and ensure the ongoing development of young radiologists. The *road map* to achieve this goal was to offer a variety of educational activities, and to develop new educational formats and content, combining theory (lectures) with practice (workshops). The *visionary guide*, the “man with the plan”, was Professor Nicholas Gourtsoyiannis. He was not only the intellectual mastermind of ESOR, but also a man with enough energy and courage to bring the project to fruition. And the rest is history. From the beginning, the ESOR was a success, and it turned out to be the right idea, with the right man, at the right time.

From the outset, the basic concept of the ESOR was to bring high-level continuing education to residents and young radiologists, and to broaden the scope of radiology teaching. The ESOR developed a wide spectrum of educational activities, including courses (e.g. Galen, Asklepios, EDIR), visiting seminars, visiting professorship programmes, tutorials, visiting scholarship programmes, exchange programmes for fellowships, and one-year fellowships. The philosophy was to be inclusive, innovative, with a focus on quality and excellence. In doing so, the ESOR reached out to other societies: as an example, the collaborative effort between the ESNR and ESOR gave birth to the establishment of a very successful Galen Foundation Course in neuroradiology. Through the ESOR courses, residents and young radiologists were given a unique opportunity to deepen their knowledge, acquire skills and develop their personality, thanks to lectures given by internationally renowned teachers and tutors, or through training in centres of excellence in Europe and beyond. For young professionals, in my opinion, one of the greatest rewards of being exposed to an international environment is that nothing is taken for granted and everyday things take on a new dimension. By carefully selecting teachers, tutors, and host centres, the ESOR has succeeded in creating such an environment. It seems that every year, the ESOR has grown, in numbers, quality and scope.

I have had the pleasure of being involved in several ESOR activities. In the department of radiology at Antwerp University Hospital, we have always welcomed “our” ESOR scholars or fellows in an environment where learning and academic achievement go hand in hand with fun and friendship, with a special emphasis on respect for different cultures. Human interaction is the force that drives the transfer of knowledge and the development of scientific collaboration. The ESOR fellows and scholars who spent three months in our department told us that they enjoyed learning how we interact with our colleagues and our patients. Conversely, we learned from our international visitors many things about their culture and, perhaps more importantly, that we share much more than we think, even though we live and function in very different environments. It doesn’t matter whether you work in Belgium, China, Russia or India: as radiologists, we all think that we need more, better, and newer equipment, and we are all convinced that we are overworked and underpaid! We have also learned that the problem of clinicians not providing sufficient clinical information is a ubiquitous one. The realisation that our similarities are much greater than our differences can help us to come to terms with and understand our condition.

My Latin teacher in high school was fond of quoting Einstein’s famous dictum that “education is what remains after one has forgotten what one has learned in school”. I am profoundly convinced that this also holds true for the thousands of young radiologists who participated in the ESOR activities: ultimately, their best memories will be of the friends they made, much more than the content of the lectures, seminars, tutorials or visiting scholarships/fellowships they attended. This is how we can build a better Europe, and indeed, a better world, for the next generation.

Since its inception, the ESOR has been an innovator, a trendsetter. New kinds of educational formats were developed. Over the years, the ESOR activities have expanded far beyond the borders of Europe, with very successful initiatives in Asia and Latin America. The ESOR has and will continue to innovate by providing more on-line content, and making good use of the electronic media, which will allow us to reach an even broader audience. Thus, the ESOR serves as a goodwill ambassador to fulfil the mission of the European Society of Radiology (ESR) in the field of education.

As President of the ESR and of the ECR 2017 (which is dedicated to “YOUTH”), I consider it a great honour and a particular pleasure to bring homage to the ESOR, to its founding father, Professor Gourtsoyiannis, and to celebrate 10 years of unparalleled excellence in radiology education, together with all of you.

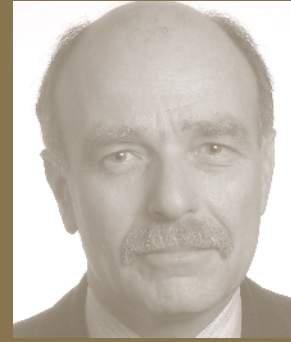

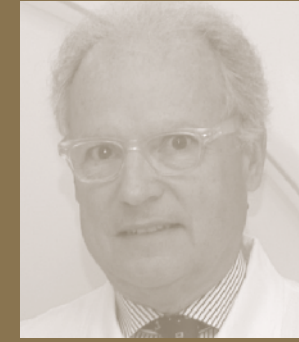

I was a final year resident when I was awarded a European Scholarship to study Breast Imaging at the Medical University of Vienna. I had completed my board exams and was commencing specialist training in breast radiology. I had worked hard to learn my chosen specialty and was looking forward to advancing my skills in MRI and whole lesion removal systems at the Medical University of Vienna. I had also been caring for my father who had just completed treatment for cancer. A resident's life and growth is never about work alone. Though academically successful I was physically and emotionally tired and had few aspirations beyond the completion of residency, fellowship and appointment as a consultant radiologist.

Arriving in Vienna was a pivotal moment for me. My tutor, Professor Katja Pinker, is a rare, inspiring and talented mentor who ensured I had the best experience possible. She organised a programme, which included all I wanted to learn, and more. Professor Pinker took me to every single congress and event in breast/oncology imaging that took place during the three months I was in Vienna. For many of these events she paid with her own money to ensure that I could attend and learn. The entire team in Vienna, Professor Herold, Professor Helbich, Professor Baltzer, Dr. Bernathova, Dr. Kapetas, Professor Dubsky and all the residents embraced me as one of their own. It was a department, which knew how to do excellent work and have fun. For me it was a time of renewal, rejuvenation and recognition of a new world of molecular imaging which had the potential to save patients' lives.

During this time I met Professor Hedwig Hricak and Professor Elizabeth Morris who were visiting Graz. My growing interest in molecular imaging and more advanced forms of breast imaging opened my eyes to new possibilities at Memorial Sloan Kettering. Being awarded the fellowship to spend six months at MSKCC was a dream come true. Professor Hricak ensured that I had the opportunity to attend all the seminars taking place within the centre. She even supported me to attend RSNA. Professor Morris welcomed all the fellows and had an outstanding programme, which comprised expert reviews in key areas of breast imaging, research mentorship and exposure to tumour board meetings.

These opportunities led me to my current role at the University of Cambridge where I have the privilege to be part of a team who are developing functional imaging techniques and personalised care algorithms to better serve those who suffer from breast cancer. The ESOR programmes changed the way in which I viewed myself. I gained confidence and found new dreams and opportunities to realise them. I am fortunate as all the individuals along my path believed in me before I believed in myself. They were there for me both as friends and trainers. They could help me to learn from mistakes and improve. They could inspire and guide and take me to places I did not know of. I could not be more grateful. They continue to remain my friends and mentors.

Last but not least, along with mentorship by those who are leaders and pioneers in radiology, was the great gift of meeting other residents, fellows and people living in the city who became my close lifelong friends. Studying in a new country gives exposure to so much more than radiology alone. The vibrant diverse city of New York and culturally rich heritage of Vienna led to exponential personal growth. Even today I do not think I fully perceive the significance of all I learnt.

Visiting Scholarship Programme – Jo Li

A special scholarship programme is the ESOR Jo Li Scholarship, initiated by Dr. Richard Fitzgerald, who trained with Dr. Jo Li in Birmingham.

The late Dr. Jo Li was born in London to a Chinese family. Having first obtained a B.Sc. and M.Sc. in Physics at the University of Birmingham, he went on to qualify as a doctor there. Dr. Li then trained as a radiologist in Birmingham and worked as a consultant radiologist at the University Hospitals, Birmingham.

The Jo Li Trust funds scholarships for radiology residents in China who are within five years of qualification, to spend three months at the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital, Birmingham. This state-of-the-art hospital opened in 2010 and is the principal teaching hospital for the University. The scholarships are aimed at fostering radiological links between Birmingham and China.

Postgraduate training is offered in adult cross-sectional imaging in the specialist area of the scholar's choice. The programme is administrated jointly by the

European Society of Radiology, European School of Radiology, and the Chinese Society of Radiology.

The first ESOR Jo Li Scholarship was awarded in 2011 to Dr. Ling Zou, West China Hospital of Sichuan University, Chengdu. She chose oncological imaging as the focus of her scholarship in Birmingham. I am sure she has benefited greatly from the experience she gained at University Hospital Birmingham. In turn, this will sow seeds for closer relationships between Radiologists in China and the Birmingham area.

Since the beginning of the collaboration between the Jo Li Trust, the European Society of Radiology, The European School of Radiology and the Chinese Society of Radiology, six scholarships were awarded to scholars coming from Chengdu, Shanghai, Beijing and Hongkong.
